



Types of Services at Great Lakes Center for Autism Treatment and Research Outpatient Programs

At the beginning of your family's time with GLC-OP, your child will be assessed and caregivers will meet with their behavior analyst to determine goals for treatment. Most of our service options involve our Applied Behavior Analysis Tutors (ABATs) working directly with your child.

Your behavior analyst will likely recommend one of the following models for service.

- 1. Early Intensive Behavior Intervention (EIBI):** These services will be provided through age 6 and focus on academic readiness skills, communication, beginning social skills and adaptive skills. Children are staffed 1:1 with an ABAT during these sessions. Clinical recommendations will typically be for 35 hours of therapy a week for this model. Duration of services are typically 6 months - 2 years.
 - a. *EIBI Availability:*

- 2. Comprehensive Behavior Intervention:** These services will be provided for children ages 7 through young adulthood. Individuals will be staffed 1:1 with an ABAT during these sessions. Clinical recommendations will typically be 20-35 hours of therapy a week for this model.
 - a. Comprehensive Behavior Intervention availability:
 - i. Heersma Autism Center
 - ii. Lawrence Autism Center

- 3. Focused Behavior Intervention:** These services will be provided for children of all ages and young adults. Individuals will be staffed 1:1 with an ABAT during these sessions. Clinical recommendations will typically be 10-20 hours of therapy a week for this model.
 - a. Focused Behavior Intervention availability:

4. Social Skills: These services will be provided for children of all ages. Children will be staffed 1:2 with ABATs for small group sessions. These sessions will work on teaching kids social and group skills to help with establishing/maintaining friendships, working cooperatively, and school readiness skills. These groups typically occur in the summer months. Availability is based on children and staff availability.

5. Potty Training: Potty training sessions

- a. Potty Training availability:
 - i. Heersma Autism Center
 - ii. Lawrence Autism Center

6. Parent Training: These sessions would be geared to the management of challenging behavior or teaching new skills for children of any age. Caregivers would be required to participate in all of the sessions and the child may or may not be involved in sessions, depending on the targets. Clinical recommendations will likely involve individual sessions for the child first and then moving into a caregiver coaching model.
