Did You Know?

- Approximately 1 in 44 children in the U.S. is diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder
- Most children are still being diagnosed after age 4, though autism can be reliably diagnosed as early as age 2
- Autism affects all ethnic and socioeconomic groups
- Minority groups tend to be diagnosed later and less often
- Early intervention affords the best opportunity to support healthy development and deliver benefits across the lifespan
- Over the last two decades, extensive research has asked whether there is any link between childhood vaccinations and autism.
